#### **STUDENTS' PROFILE**



This results in lesser capability among women which is turn produces a snowball effect on their empowerment and access to development initiatives.eam

From the analysis, the team understood that the college is operating in an environment where everyone has access to full range of opportunities to achieve the social, psychological and physical benefits within the college campus.

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
The above table giving gender wise details of students in the College provides the information regarding growth of students' strength in the last five years. In the year 2018-19, out of 828 total students 62.92% were female students as compared to 37.07% male students. The further years shows continuous increase in female students like of 67.86% in the year 2022-23.

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



Under the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act,2006 (PCMA), Govt. of West Bengal has introduced the Kanyashree Prakalpa which bagged an UN award in 2018, seeks to improve the status and wellbeing of girls, specifically those from socio-economically disadvantaged families through Conditional Cash Transfer. Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya has perfectly worked towards providing this benefit to numerous girl students. The Kanyashree Committee has been functional for this purpose. About 252 girls are enjoying this financial assistance in terms of K1 and K2 grants in the year 2018-23.

Aikyashree Scholarship, a welfare scheme by the West Bengal Minorities' Department & Finance Corporation to provide financial assistance to minorities students to decrease dropout rates and continue their studies. The data below shows that girl students are availing more of this scholarship which is a good sign for the society and the college has been successful in motivating them to continue their studies.

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





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
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# GENDER BALANCE AS HEADS OF OFFICES AND STATUTORY BODIES AND DIFFERENT COMMITTEES:

Percentage of distribution of members in the GB





Percentage of distribution of members in the IQAC



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#### **GENDER SENSITISATION INITIATIVES:**

- Toilets: Basic sanitation facility in the form of separate toilets for the students and staff is provided in each floor of the college. The Teachers' staff room is also provided with separate toilets for male and female faculty. The college office has its own separate washroom too.
- CCTV Surveillance: The college has CCTV monitoring devices installed at different location within the campus. The college provides equal opportunity to one and all. The college has a Women's Cell to carry out various gender sensitization programs.
- Ladies Common Room: There is adequate space in the Ladies Common Room and silence is maintained for girls to study. The College played a pioneering role by installing sanitary napkin vending machines in the girls' common room which has been instrumental in promoting menstrual hygiene and cleanliness among the girl students. Washroom provision has also been made for girls in the Ladies Common Room.
- Girls' Washroom: Girls' washrooms are situated in each floor of the college with ample water supply and proper maintenance.
- Drinking Water: Water purifiers have been provided for both boys and girls in the College campus.
- Internal Complaint Committee (ICC): The College has constituted an Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) as per the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act and Rule 2013. Having raised the bar of responsibility and accountability in the Vishaka Guidelines, the Supreme Court placed an obligation on workplaces, institutions and those in positions of responsibility, to uphold working women's fundamental right to equality and dignity at the workplace. Three key obligations were imposed on institutions to meet that standard, namely-Prohibition, Prevention and Redress. In 2013, the Government of India notified the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act. Consistent with the Vishaka judgment, the Act aspires to ensure women's right to work place equality, protection from sexual harassment through compliance with the above mentioned three elements. It is important to note that the Act provides a civil remedy to women in addition to other laws that are currently in force. Consequently, any woman who wishes to report instances of sexual harassment at the workplace has the right to take recourse of both civil and criminal proceedings.




Do you feel safe inside the college campus?











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Are women well represented in the college administration?
