Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya began its journey in 2007 on the campus of Jangipara D.N. High School with the mission of extending higher education to the youth of rural areas. It is the only general degree college in the Jangipara block of Hooghly district. The college is a state-aided institution affiliated with the University of Calcutta. It received UGC recognition under Section 2(f) in 2014 and under Section 12(B) in 2018. The institution was accredited with a B grade by NAAC in 2025.

At present, the college offers B.A. Honours and Multidisciplinary courses in Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Arabic, Education, History, and Philosophy, along with Multidisciplinary courses in Political Science and Geography under the CCF framework of NEP 2020.

The college envisions guiding students towards holistic education through discipline, devotion, and dedication. It aspires to become a centre of knowledge, culture, skills, traditional values, and service to humanity. Its mission is to impart quality and inclusive education irrespective of caste, creed, gender, or economic status, while promoting educational opportunities for underprivileged sections of society and fostering the spirit of universal brotherhood.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya began its glorious journey on 12th July 2007 in the building of Jangipara D.N. High School in the morning session under the supervision of Dr. Chandidas Mukhopadhyaya, former Principal of Chapadanga Rabindra Mahavidyalaya. Within a few years, the college acquired its own building and a new establishment at its present location, thanks to the monumental efforts of the then Honourable Education Minister of the Government of West Bengal, Dr Sudarshan Roychowdhury.

The college is situated in the rural hinterland of the Hooghly district, located at a distance of 13 km from Seakhala and 16 km from Haripal station. The college is surrounded by lush greenery and is away from the din and bustle of city life.

Named after notable freedom fighter Shri Mahitosh Nandy (1918-1992), who was born at Garbati, near Chandannagar Hooghly, Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya aims to impart higher education to the students of this rural area.

The long-cherished dream of the people of this area would not have become a reality had not Shri Monsharam Chauli and his brothers and sisters generously donated the land to establish this college here. Besides, a grant of Rs 45 lakhs each from the then Education Minister, Government of West Bengal, Dr. Sudarshan Roychowdhury and the then Honourable Member of Parliament Shri Santashree Chatterjee, and a grant of Rs 36 lakhs from the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal went a long way in developing the infrastructure of the college. The college also received a grant of Rs 5 lakhs from Zila Pariishad. A grant of Rs 30 Lakhs was also received from the former Honourable Member of Parliament Md. Ruhul Amin. A grant of Rs 9.5 lakhs was also received from the former Member of Legislative Assembly Shri Snehasish Chakraborty. All these contributions have been utilised to develop the infrastructure, enriching resources and collecting modern equipment that are required in modern teaching and learning.

The college got recognition under Section 2F in September 2014 and 12 B of the UGC in April 2018.

The main objective of Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya, Jangipara, Hooghly is to impart higher education to the young generation of this rural area, who had to travel 15 to 20 kms to reach to the nearest degree college.

Within this short period of time, Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya has started to bloom in all spheres of educational excellence. It is affiliated to the University of Calcutta, and offers Honours and General courses in subjects like Arabic, Bengali, English, History, Sanskrit Philosophy and Education along with a General Degree Course in Geography and Political Science.

Though many students are first-generation learners, the college has started to show excellence in the academic field through its notable results in the university examinations, and the fact that it was accredited with Grade B by NAAC in 2025 in its very first attempt and cycle.

Even some students graduating from our college have shown excellence by qualifying in NET/ SET Examinations, after having completed their Master's Degrees.

Seminars and talks are organised by the college to increase the horizon of knowledge of the students. The college also provides several facilities to the differently able students to continue their education.

Finally, Mahitosh Nandy Mahavidyalaya offers quality and holistic education to students, which not only helps them to stand on their own feet, but also to become good human beings as well by instilling moral values in their minds.

Internship and Exit

All students are required to do one 3 Credits Internship at the end of the 2nd, 4th or 6th Semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd Semester will be allowed to exit from the Course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 (42+3) Credits. Students completing Internship at the end of 4th Semester will be allowed to exit from the Course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 (85+3) Credits.

Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th Semester and after successful completion of all 6 Semesters will be awarded B.A/B.Sc. Degree of 132 (129+3) or 128 (125+3) Credits.

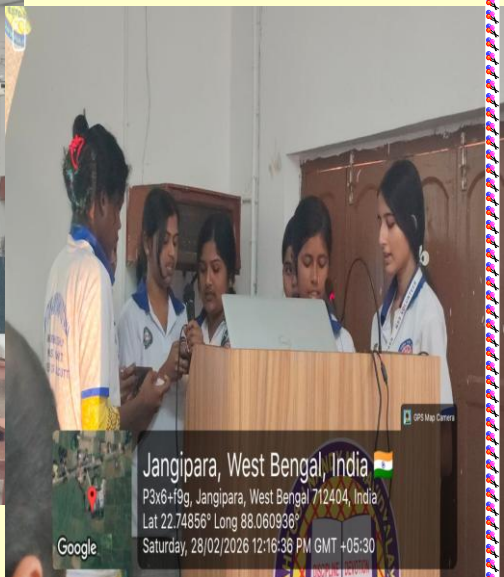
